# Officers to patrol beaches for clamming violations

Oregon State Police and the Clatsop County Sheriff's Office will be patrolling beaches to ensure there is not unau-

thorized razor clamming.

Razor clamming remains closed from Astoria to Florence (including inside the

Columbia River) due to high domoic acid levels.

Mussel, bay clam, and crab harvesting remain open along the entire Oregon coast. Coastal scallops are not affected by biotoxin closures when only the adductor muscle is eaten. Oregon Department of Agriculture does not recommend eating whole scallops. Commercial shellfish products remain safe for consumers.

Paralytic shellfish toxins and domoic acid toxins are produced by algae and originate in the ocean. ODA will continue to test for shellfish toxins twice per month, as tides and weather permit. Reopening an area closed for biotoxins requires two consecutive tests with results below the closure limit.
