Steve Augeri, the former lead singer of classic '70s rock group Journey, will perform his melodic rock tunes at 7 p.m. Saturday, July 31 – the fair's closing day.

Tickets for Turner's performance are \$45 reserved and \$35 for lawn seating. Tickets for Augeri's concert are \$40 and \$30. Children 12 and younger are free with a paid adult.

Lunch listening sessions focus on ADA history

Disability rights activist Judy Heumann, recently featured in the Oscar-nominated documentary "Crip Camp," will kick off a series of weekly Lunch and Learn webinar sessions on July 6 in recognition of the 31st anniversary of the Americans with Disabilities Act.

Hosted by the Oregon Disabilities Commission and the Northwest ADA Center, the free weekly sessions will be held virtually to allow more Oregonians to have access to this important information.

In addition to Heumann, the series will feature top accessibility advocates as well as equity and crisis experts.

Among them are Russell Lehmann, an award-winning and internationally recognized motivational speaker; artist Sabine Rear; Erin Taylor, health promotion coordinator for the OHSU Oregon Office on Disability and Health; and

Rebecca Bolante, director of Bolante.net, which provides training on dealing with critical events.

Heumann's session is the first of four free weekly Lunch and Learn sessions. The topics and schedule for the July events, all of

which will be from noon to 1 p.m., are as follows:

Tuesday, July 6: Heumann's "History of the ADA & Section 504."

Tuesday, July 13: Lehmann

speaks on behavioral health.

Tuesday, July 20: "Equity: Intersectionality, Social Construction of Disabilities, & Disability Justice" by Taylor.

Tuesday, July 27: "Inclusive Emergency Planning and COVID-19 Equity" by Bolante, Glenna Hayes of UCP Connections and Tom Stenson of Disability Rights Oregon.

Craft brewers team up for trees

Several Oregon craft beverage producers have teamed up with a nonprofit group to replant trees in areas decimated by the 2020 wildfires.

Pelican Brewing Company, which has three locations on the coast including Cannon Beach; Portland Cider Company; Sunriver Brewing, which is based in Bend; and Willamette Valley-based Stoller Wine Group will donate \$1 from every six-pack sold in July and August to Oregon Parks Forever.

The nonprofit group is raising money to replant 25,000 trees through the "You Buy One, We Plant One" campaign.

Each dollar collected will cover the cost of planting one tree.

"We are thrilled to have the support of these fine craft beverage producers toward this important project," said Seth Miller, director of Oregon Parks Forever. "Trees provide the very necessities of life."
