violating vehicle. Commissioners voting no -- Lylla Gaebel and Kevin Swanson - said they preferred a smaller fine of \$100 to \$500 per day.

The Mennas did not attend the meeting.

The Mennas also did not return phone calls and an email from the Columbia Press asking about their plans for the property. As of Wednesday, just one RV remained there, along with the storage container.

"We've given them every opportunity over the course of three months to stop what they're doing and tell us their plans," Chairman Paul Mitchell said. "I think a fine should be assessed and it should be a hefty fine."

The higher fine seems to be overreaching on the city's part, Gaebel said.

"I have real mixed feelings about this because people all over the city have their RVs parked on their front lawns and everywhere else," she said. "I would not really support a huge fine. ... Since it is per day, that builds up pretty fast."

Swanson wanted the fine to be an "attention getter," perhaps starting low and growing on a per-day basis.

"They ignored us. They ignored the notices," Mitchell said. "They've tied into a system and we don't know whether it's leaking. ... I think these people have shown bad faith all along."
