State extends time for health plans

The annual open enrollment period for purchasing private health insurance will be extended this year, the federal government announced.

Health plans can be selected from Nov. 1 to Jan. 15 for 2022.

Along with the extension, Oregonians have access to the largest pool of money ever for purchases made through the Oregon Health Insurance Marketplace due to the American Rescue Plan.

More than 80 percent of Oregonians are eligible for financial help through the Marketplace since the American Rescue Plan provisions took effect.

Oregonians receive an average of \$437 per month in premium tax credits.

The Warriors won the next three sets, 25-21, 25-19, and then a walk-away win of 25-13.

The Warrior's took a 6-0 lead within 30 seconds of the opening kickoff of last Friday night's match-up against the Sutherlin Bulldogs.
