Quake tips on how soon and how big

Geologist Tom Horning will present a talk on "Preparing for Tsunamis: How Soon and How Big?" at 7 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 12, in the Riverside Room at Seaside Civic and Convention Center, 415 First Ave.

The free event is presented by Seaside's CERT (Community Emergency Response Team).

The familiar topic will have a twist as Horning talks about the geology of the Cascadia Subduction Zone in 2021. He'll talk about how earthquakes and
