

take a job in Portland.

The staff member who chose leave has been a volunteer with the department for 18 years.

"It's tough to see them step away," Alsbury said. "It's his personal choice or conviction. ... He didn't think it was the morally correct thing to ask for exemption."

Balensifer, who has been out of town much of the month, took a lot of flack from the public over his letter. Some assumed he wasn't concerned about the health risk of unvaccinated emergency workers treating the medically vulnerable or spreading COVID-19 in the community.

"The city of Warrenton has said that we will comply with the law," he posted in a Facebook Live message. "I was truly scared; we have struggled and continue to struggle getting volunteers for the department."

He added that he was pleased "the looming crisis has been averted."

For the seven department members with exemptions, Chief Alsbury vowed none of them will be used for medical calls if there are other resources available. fore we even ask or pull them in to help. ... We don't want to put anybody in that position of wondering, 'Are all the firefighters in my house vaccinated?'"
