Bicyclist dies after being struck by auto in Seaside

A bicyclist was killed Saturday night when he was struck by a pickup truck on Highway 101 near the junction with Highway 26.

Zane Belshe, 59, of Seaside was riding on the northbound shoulder when he was struck by a northbound Nissan Frontier at 6:11 p.m. Dec. 18.

The pickup's driver, Jesse Holmes, 34, of Seaside failed to stay within his lane and struck the cyclist, according to an Oregon State Police investigation.

Belshe was pronounced dead at the scene. The highway was closed for 4 1/2 hours while officers investigated the crash.
