Seaside teacher killed in car crash

Seaside School District's band director was killed along with another driver Saturday when their vehicles collided on Highway 26.

Kyle Rieger, 26, of Warrenton suffered major injuries and was flown to Oregon Health & Science University in Portland, where he died.

Fredrick Scheffler, 49, of Portland was pronounced dead at the scene.

Scheffler was headed west on Highway 26, about 10 miles east of Seaside, when he lost control of his 2020 Tesla Model Y and collided with Rieger's Hyundai Tucson van, which was headed east, according to Oregon State Police.

The highway was partially closed for 3 ½ hours.
