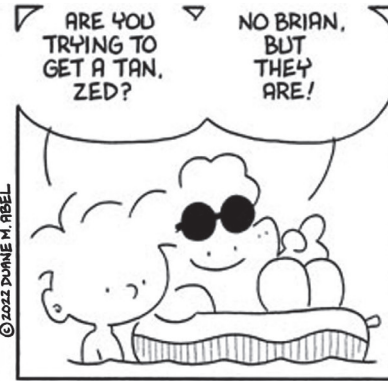
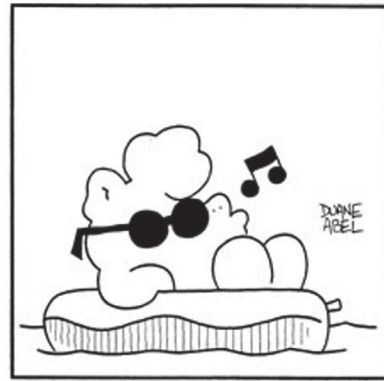

## Cemetery: Students hope to uncover site's history

tion instructor.

Ocean View Cemetery was designed by nationally known landscape architect Ernest W. Bowditch in 1898. It replaced and largely destroyed the county cemetery at the far north end of the site. The graves of those with no relatives willing to pay to move them to Ocean View were abandoned.

The older, no longer used section of the cemetery likely contains what many would refer to as "marginalized"

populations. There are references to Chinese and native American graves that need to be researched and verified, Goodenberger said.

There are stories of grave desecration, the selling of corpses to medical schools, and the irreverent plowing of gravesites by road builders.

Research conducted as part of the project will examine the original entrance off Ninth Street, the former Clatsop and pauper portions, and Bowditch's original design. But perhaps the most imme-

diate and practical benefit will be the cleaning and restoration of grave markers.

The Historic Preservation program, in partnership with the Astoria Parks and Recreation Department, will conduct a workshop for students and community members during spring term 2023 to provide training and restore grave markers. Faculty and students will start the research and document history starting this fall.

The Oregon Commission on Historic Cemeteries awarded \$63,700 in grants to 19 historic cemetery projects throughout the state. Ocean View, with 16,000 interments, was the only one chosen in Clatsop County.

The state considers historic cemeteries to be those that include the burial of at least one person who died 75 years before the current date.

Ocean View is one of five historic cemeteries in the Warrenton/Hammond area. The others are the Clatsop County Pauper Cemetery, Clatsop Plains Pioneer Cemetery, the Warren Family Cemetery that includes the remains of city founder Daniel K. Warren and his wife, and Fort Stevens Military Cemetery.
