YOUNG CHILD VACCINATIONS

Columbia Memorial Hospital will hold a COVID-19 vaccination event July 14 for children ages 6 months to 5 years old.

The Pfizer clinic will be from 2 to 5:30 p.m. in the CMH-OHSU Health Pediatric Clinic, 2265 Exchange St., Astoria.

The FDA authorized the Pfizer vaccination for young children last week. The clinic event is open to any child in the community within the stated age group when accompanied by their parent or guardian. Children do not need to be established patients at CMH.

There are 56 slots available. Prior registration is required at columbiamemorial.org/vaccine-clinic. CMH will send a confirmation email after registration.

Those unable to attend can make an appointment with the pediatric clinic, CMH patient care clinic, or Clatsop County Public Health Department.
