County records 54th COVID death

Clatsop County officially has recorded 54 deaths connected to COVID.

The death occurred in July at a local hospital and the victim was elderly and partially vaccinated, said Jiancheng Huang, director of Public Health.

"We extend our deepest condolences to the loved ones of this person," Huang said. "Every death is a sad development in our efforts to fight this disease."

New cases are increasing in Clatsop County and other regions of the state because of a new subvariant, he said.
