Warrenton nurse recognized for extraordinary service

Mike Cahn, a same-day surgery nurse at Columbia Memorial Hospital, is the latest recipient of the hospital's DAISY Award for Extraordinary Nurses.

Cahn, who lives in Warrenton, is CMH's fifth DAISY honoree. He has been a CMH nurse for more than three years and was nominated by a patient and his wife who wrote a letter to the hospital following his surgery.

"Starting an IV in him is often very painful. We always ask the nurse to take their time to make this as comfortable as possible," they wrote. "Michael used a lot of lidocaine and gave it time to numb his arm.

"He hardly felt the IV insertion and is very grateful that Michael was patient, thoughtful, understanding and gentle, and even willing to put up with his silly jokes."

The DAISY Foundation was created in 1999 after 33-year-old J. Patrick Barnes died of complications from an auto-immune disease. DAISY is an acronym for Diseases At-

tacking the Immune System.

Barnes spent the last eight weeks of his life in hospitals. The nursing care he received profoundly impacted his family. Barnes' family created the foundation and award to honor nurses who provide outstanding care to patients and patient families.

Award recipients receive a DAISY pin, a personalized

certificate, and a stone sculpture called "The Healer's Touch" made by the Shona people of Zimbabwe.

Razor clamming remains closed

Despite the expected Oct. 1 opening of Clatsop County beaches to razor clamming, the Oregon Department of Agriculture and state Fish and Wildlife have instead closed all razor clam harvesting from the Washington border to Cascade Head (just north of Lincoln City).

Domoic acid, a marine toxin, is above the human

health limit, delaying the opening of the popular Clatsop beaches harvest.

The season will open when two consecutive tests show domoic acid levels below the human health closure limit.

Mussel harvesting also remains closed, but recreational bay clam and crab harvesting is open.
