THE GREAT STRIKE.
 The long strike in the East still goes on to its consequence. The determination of the railroad authorities to crush the spirit of Knighthood at every point along the Gould system is as strong now as ever. The sharp cracking of pistols and Winchester have already been heard at Fort Worth, (Texas) and East St. Louis, where a few of the Knights have sacrificed their lives, and where, also, one deputy sheriff was killed and two mortally wounded. Troops are now visiting the scenes of disturbance along the Gould system. A fight between labor and capital would be a short one. During its continuance, all the human sympathy that is worth anything would go to the side of the oppressed. History tells of periods when the fellow-feeling of the common people was disheartened; but history will never have a line of that sort in relation to fellow-feeling in this republic. Fellowship in this republic is now a mighty giant, cursing the tyranny that has invaded the shadow of its vine and fig tree. The flag of the three million Knights now in the field is the flag of a majority, consisting of the toiling sons of this republic, and it is therefore the flag of this nation. Will the government get hindlings to fire on the Star and Stripes floating above the brawny shoulders of tired and discouraged labor? The government would then be the mob.

The following land bill for the benefit of soldiers has been introduced in the House:
 "All honorably discharged soldiers of the Union army in the war of the rebellion shall have the right to purchase 160 acres of public land at the minimum price which such land is sold, \$1.25 per acre. Those who served one year are privileged to purchase at three-fourths of the minimum price; two years, one-half; three years at one-fourth. No settlement or residence is required, and the bill is in addition to any rights under the pre-emption or homestead act. These privileges extend to the heirs of such soldiers, but no sale or transfer of the land thus purchased can be made within three years from the time of obtaining title."

In the House of Representatives on the 10th, Congressman Hermann of Oregon, presented a petition to the House from citizens of Lake county, Oregon, asking Congress to prevent the California and Oregon Land Company from occupying the finest lands in Goose Lake and other valleys unlawfully. He states the Company is in possession of the land grant of the Oregon Central Military Wagon Road, which it did not earn, and has taken much valuable land for indemnity. The petitioners are ready to furnish evidence that the land grant was never earned.

Morrison's putting wool on the free list in his late tariff bill will very likely insure its defeat. There is just as much reason for placing other articles on the free list as wool, though they are left untouched by the bill. The iron and coal men say they must have a tariff to protect them against foreign productions, and so say the wool men. We say let the duty remain on wool until we get ready to reduce it all along the line.

The re-nomination of Prof McElroy for Superintendent of Public Instruction, by the Republicans, seems to be almost a certainty if the unanimous voice of the press indicates anything.

Senator Mitchell has introduced a bill in the senate granting the Oregon railroad and bridge company the right to construct a bridge over the Willamette river in the vicinity of Ray's landing.

Hearst, the newly appointed Senator from California, cast his first vote in the Senate against the bill for the admission of Washington Territory to statehood.

Recent voting on the silver coinage bill shows that a strong majority in the lower house of Congress is in favor of allowing the existing law to continue unaltered.

The cut rates have been very beneficial to the lumber dealers of California, who have shipped 2,500 cars of lumber East since the war began.
