The Prohibitionists of Rhode Island have succeeded in the Prohibition amendment to the State constitution, and as a result there is great rejoicing in the little State.

Grand Master Workman Powderly has called the general assembly of the Knights of labor of the United States and Canada to meet in Cleveland, on May 25th, to consider the general labor troubles throughout the country and propose legislation in reference to some system of arbitration in disputes between employers and employees.

The Salem Statesman can't understand why all the lights for prohibition is being made in Western Oregon, where the heaviest majorities are Republican, and no movement is being made in Eastern Oregon, where the Democrats cast the most votes. A majority of the Prohibitionists have heretofore been Republican, and it is natural that the former organization should be strongest where Republicans have been the most numerous.

The counties of Benton, Clackamas, Columbia, Coos, Douglas, Gilliam, Jackson, Josephine, Klamath, Lin, Marion and Yamhill have all paid their taxes up square and are out of debt so far as claims of the state against them are concerned. Curry county only owes \$300 to the state while Clatsop, Crook, Union, Morrow and Multnomah have as yet paid nothing on their account since the levy of 1885. Some of the counties owe for several years back but Multnomah county owes the state more than all the other counties have paid for the treasury during 1886.
