JUSTICE WITH GENEROSITY

We are glad to see that Congressman Holman adopts the world's suggestion that the imposition of a tax on incomes to meet the expense of future pension bills would be the most practical method of checking prodigal appropriations.

Some time ago when it was said that Mr. Morison proposed to amend the House rules so as to make it in order to provide for a special tax to raise the amount required whenever an increase of pensions was contemplated by a bill, we suggested that to bring the knowledge of what they were taxed for home to the people the tax imposed should be a direct one, like the income


