JUSTICE WITH GENEROSITY. We are glad to see that Congressman Holman adopts the world's suggestion that the imposition of a tax on incomes to meet the expense of future pension bills would be the most practical method of checking prodigal appropriations.

Some time ago when it was said that Mr. Morison proposed to amend the House rules so as to make it in order to provide for a special tax to raise the amount required whenever an increase of pensions was contemplated by a bill, we suggested that to bring the knowledge of what they were taxed for home to the people the tax imposed should be a direct one, like the income tax.

Mr. Holman is reported by a special Washington correspondent of the Commercial Advertiser as saying: "I think the Senate will pass a big pension bill, and when it comes over to the House I suppose we shall have to except it, but will put on to it a proposition to raise the amount by an income tax. Perhaps the Senate may not wish to adopt that. But in my opinion nothing will please the pensioner so well as to know that money is coming from the rich. My idea would be to tax all incomes over \$5,000, and the House will take that means either to kill and big pension bill or else to make the rich people pay it."

It is to be hoped that the course marked out by Mr. Holman many be pursued. But the tax ought to be limited to incomes of \$5,000 and upward, and the rate raised with every \$5,000 increase of income. By this policy we should be liberal to pensioners at the expense of those who can afford it, and not at the expense of persons much worse off than themselves.—N. Y. World.
