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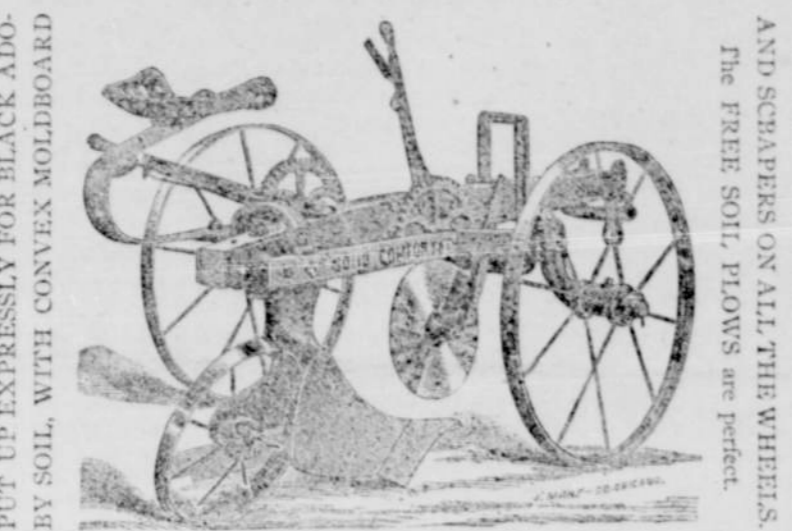

NOTICE is hereby given that Willard Young, whose post office address is Cascade Locks, Wasco county, Oregon, has this day filed his application for a patent for 1500 linear feet of the "St. Peter's" mine or vein, bearing gold, with surface ground, 600 feet, situated in the Grave Creek Mining District, County of Josephine, and State of Oregon, and designated by the field notes and official plat now on file in the office as lot No. 37, in unsurveyed lands. Said lot No. 37 being described as follows, to-wit:

There being no public survey or established corners within the required limits, I therefore establish a bearing monument, or initial point, with which to connect said survey. Said monument consists of a trap rock in place, 8 by 10 feet at the base and 8 feet high, and marked on the south side thereof with the letters S. P., cut with a chisel in the rock. From the bearing monument, Section mountain bears S 30 deg. 20 min. W, about 6 miles. Ditchman's Peak in the Siskiyou mountains near the State line bears S 12 deg. W. Dyer's hydraulic mine on Tom East creek bears S 52 deg. W. Pottersville house on Grave creek bears S 20 deg. 30 min. W. A monument is located on the summit of Mt. St. Peter, on the divide between Grave and Coyote Creeks, and at the head of Tom East creek. I commenced said survey at the S W corner at post No. 1, from which the bearing monument bears N 30 deg. E, 525 feet, and a white oak 10 inches in diameter bears N 48 deg. W, 10 feet, and a black oak 15 inches in diameter bears N 10 deg. W, 14 feet. There is 1 run N 20 deg. W, on W boundary of claim, var. 19 degs. 30 min. E. (Instrument used is improved solar compass). 390 feet - corner line of claim, line 25, 683 feet - set post for corner No. 2, on divide between Grave and Coyote creeks, from which a fir 38 inches in diameter bears N 25 deg. W, 11 feet, a fir 40 inches in diameter bears N 70 deg. E, 85 feet. Summit shaft bears S 70 deg. E, 240 feet. There is 1 run N 70 deg. E, on S boundary, along hill-side facing north, 1500 feet. Set a post for corner No. 2, from which - 150 a fir 12 inches in diameter bears S 25 deg. W, 15 feet. Cut No. 3 bears N 13 deg. W, 260 feet. There is 20 min. east on east side line 265 feet - summit of ridge, corner east and west plus 35, 690 feet - set post for corner No. 4, from which - 25 a fir 12 inches in diameter, bears N 42 deg. east, 17 feet. A pine 8 inches in diameter bears north 22 deg. west, 23 feet. A cypress and spruce and blacksmith shop bears south 24 deg. west 250 feet. A discovery shaft No. 1 and tunnel bear north 63 deg. west 302 feet. Locating monument bears south of degs. 10 min. west, 1145 feet. There is 20 deg. west along a hill-side, bearing 1520 feet - summit on line plus 125, 1550 feet - place of beginning, and containing 25, 65 acres.

The adjoining claimants are Edward Sanderson Smith and Willard Young. 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NOTICE is hereby given that Willard Young, whose post office address is Cascade Locks, Wasco county, Oregon, has this day filed his application for a patent for 1500 linear feet of the "St. Peter's" mine or vein bearing gold, with surface ground, 600 feet in width, situated in Grave Creek Mining District, County of Josephine, and State of Oregon, and designated by the field notes and official plat now on file in the office as lot No. 39, in unsurveyed lands. Said lot being described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a post set in a mound of stone 4 feet square for corner No. 1, from which bearing monument bears north 64 degs. 15 min. east, 434 feet. 1 run north 20 degs. west on line between claims 37 and 39, var. 19 degs. 30 min. east, 390 feet. Post corner No. 2, of claim 37, and center line of claim 20, 600 feet, a fir 14 inches in diameter, mark it for corner No. 2, from which (minus 50) a fir 26 inches in diameter bears south 18 degs. east, 25 feet. There is 20 deg. west on W boundary, 1500 feet. Set post for corner No. 3, from which (minus 250) a laurel 6 inches in diameter bears west 14 deg. east, 6 inches in diameter bears south 62 deg. east, 22 feet. There is 20 deg. east on end line parallel with end line of claim No. 37, 425 feet, summit of ridge bears east and west (plus 75), 690 feet. Set post corner No. 4, from which (minus 10) a yellow pine, 24 inches in diameter, bears south 85 deg. west, 14 feet. Discovery shaft and cut bear north 13 deg. east, 250 feet. There is 20 deg. west on W boundary, 1500 feet, post corner at place of beginning (plus 235), containing 17, 94 acres.
