Mining Notes.

Call on H. C. Perkins, United States Deputy Mineral Surveyor, for work in his line.

The Sharp Brothers left Thursday morning for Sutton, Cal., for a 5 weeks visit to their old home.

Everybody in Tillamook is getting the mining fever. Southern Oregon and Klondike are about equal as points of eager interest.—Tillamook Herald.

Mr. J. D. Stevens of Pleasant creek, made us a pleasant call last Saturday. Mr. Stevens informed us that mining on Pleasant creek would be carried on quite extensively this winter.

T. J. Clark of Grave creek, was in the city Monday. Mr. Clark is doing considerable work on his placer this winter and expects to take out some good dust.

Captain A. M. Brown and his brother went to Portland Tuesday night, where the Captain intends to fit out a private expedition for the Klondike, to start about June 1st. Captain Brown spent two or three years in the frozen regions of the Yukon.

Messrs Courtney and Cramer of Merlin, who own a promising porphyry dyke a few miles north of Grants Pass, were in town Tuesday. They have ordered a small mill from San Francisco, with which to crush their ore, and expect to have it up and running before spring.

A wonderful discovery of free milling gold ore has been made in the Althouse district. Mr. Frank Hauston in prospecting above his placer mine in Iron creek, a tributary of Althouse creek, about 3 miles above Brownstown ran across a creamy white quartz ledge seven feet in diameter carrying phenomenally rich ore. Mr. Wm Johnson of the Layton Hotel, has samples of the ore on exhibition.

J. H. King, of the Oregon Bonanza Mining Company has just returned from San Francisco and reports that his company has sold the Bonanza mine on Williams creek to W. K. Rogers & Co., of the Bay City, for the sum of \$40,000. This property is one of the Southern Oregon mines that has long since past the prospect stage and has been a paying institution since its first inception. We hope the new company will realize their most sanguine expectations and that the property will prove to be a real bonanza.

The Goldyke camp has been a busy one for the past two weeks. A force of five men has been engaged in enlarging and timbering the shaft, which is now 48 feet in the clear and timbered with 10-inch hewed timbers. Twenty feet has been reached and the vein shows a width of three feet of milling ore of high grade. Headquarters have been established at the mill site on Berry creek. New buildings will soon be erected, and the working force increased.

Mr. Wm Noel and son, of Merlin, have a group of three claims six miles nearly north of Grants Pass on the mountain lying between Prospect creek and Jump-off-Joe, which prospect well in red gold. The ledge seems to be a true fissure vein lying between serpentine and porphyry and is seven feet in width. Specimens of the rock shown us taken from the surface were literally bedecked with the yellow metal. This was no doubt an over average sample, but the boys inform us that the whole porphyry dyke, several hundred feet in width, a long side of which the ledge runs, carries appreciable amounts of gold.
