Best Time For Planting Trees.

Very small trees or shrubs of sm size, unless of very bardy nature, should, if practicable, be planted in the spring Trees and shrubs of fair size from the nursery can be planted in the fall with good success. The present month of October is one of the best times to get such stock in the ground, If planting be deferred until later there is not so much chance of their making new root fibers before the winter sets in. Ever greens will generall do better planted in the spring than in the fall, unless it be some of the hardiest sorts, such as the Norway spruce. Trees having fleshy roots, such as the magnolias, chestnus and the like, also generally do better if set out in the snring; but if carefully planted in the fall, not later than this month, they should do well if in a fairly protected place and not allowed to dry ont too much before winter.
