HAPPENINGS OF THE PAST FEW DAYS FROM ALL QUARTERS.

American Trap-Shooters Beat English and Scotch Teams—A Battleship is Taken Through Hell Gate—Peculiar Suit For Divorce and Damages.

Capital is said to be leaving Paris because of a socialist scare.

The supreme court of Tennessee has decided that women cannot practice law in that state.

Henry Xavier, known all over the country among horticulturists, especially by raisers of grapes, died in Mount Vernon, N. Y., aged 75 years.

The remains of ex-Governor Pingree of Michigan, who died in London, were shipped at Southampton June 23 for New York.

The American trap-shooters were entertained at a farewell banquet in the Cafe Royal, London, by the Midlanders Gun Club. Political Biglow was present.

The British team and the editors of the leading shooting papers were present.

Sergeant Gage of the Midlanders Gun club paid over the £2,000 purse and delivered the cup won by the various American shooters. The Americans also gained a victory over the Scotch team at Glasgow.

At Camden, Ark., Tom Watson, who, with his wife, falsely swore that the negro Will Bussey had committed an assault upon Mrs. Watson, was taken out by a committee of citizens and given \$500 bills. The testimony of Watson and his wife was the means of Bussey's being sentenced to be hanged, but Mrs. Watson recently confessed that she was forced by her husband to swear falsely against Bussey, and on learning this Governor Davis suspended the negro's sentence. Watson was placed on a train going south and given instructions not to remain in Arkansas.

Leander Southard, a well-to-do farmer of Norwood, L. I., began suit against his neighbor, John Johnson, for \$10,000 for alienating his wife's affections. Three years ago Mrs. Southard told her husband that she loved Farmer Johnson.

She declared, however, that she had done no wrong, and refused to leave the house. Southard thereupon drew a chalk line through the premises, and neither has crossed the other's territory.

Every Saturday night Southard left his wife money on the line. Johnson was a frequent caller, but Southard only glared at him across the chalk line.

Mrs. Southard recently left her little boy the chalk line and disappeared for the night. Southard thought this sufficient provocation for divorce and damages, hence the action.

The Hamburg-American line Deutschland arrived at Plymouth June 19, having come 1,082 miles in 5 days, 11 hours and 51 minutes, at an average speed of 23.36 against 23.36, her best

previous record.

CRIMES AND ACCIDENTS.

Fourteen persons are believed to have been killed and a number injured as the result of a fire following an explosion among a quantity of fireworks in the store of Abram Hattenberg at Paterson, N. J.

D. B. Jones, a negro preacher, who, it is alleged, attempted to commit an assault on Mrs. Davis, was taken from the guardhouse at La Grange, N. C., and lynched.

Frank Smith and F. D. Mel and held at Benton, La., for complicity in the murder of John Gray Foster, were taken out of jail by a mob and strung up to a tree. The lynchers said that it was necessary to put these negroes to death in order to preserve the lives of white men in the locality.

These persons were killed and several injured by lightning during a severe electric storm which passed over Indiana. At Greentown and Hartford City there was much damage to property.

A Rock Springs (Wyo.) dispatch says that George Echar, a Philippino volunteer, who raised a check several months ago and who shot and killed Deputy Sheriff C. B. Hobson and fatally wounded Fred Rorke while resisting arrest, was captured and placed in jail at Evanston. He narrowly missed lynching at the hands of a mob near Thomas Francis' ranch, and only the vigilance and determination of the officers in charge of the prisoner prevented summary justice being meted out.

George R. Lawrence, an adventurous photographer, who went up in a balloon at Chicago, fell 300 feet with his car as a parachute, struck upon his feet and escaped without a scratch. The balloon became separated from the car by the breaking of the ropes, but with remarkable presence of mind Lawrence grasped the two sledges above the platform, so that the platform and the parachute, thereby breaking the force of the fall.

Eight lives were lost in a tornado at Napier, Neb. The killed were members of the Greening and Anderson families. The town of Napier was nearly wiped out.

IN THE PHILIPPINES.

A dispatch dated from Santa Cruz, Laguna province, June 24, says: Gen. Calles, the insurgent commander, has given a demonstration of his honesty of purpose and his influence over the Filipinos by issuing a proclamation forbidding his countrymen from supporting Colonel Caballes, who took to the mountains with 100 riflemen last Friday night. General Calles with 300 riflemen, an indecisive mob of volunteers, and four cannon, surrendered quietly this (Monday) morning. The insurgent commander and his men afterward took the oath of allegiance.

In consequence of the surrender of General Calles, all of the insurgent prisoners on Luzon island will be released. Information from native sources confirms the previous reports that Gen. Malvar will soon surrender.

Civil government will be established in the Philippines on July 1st. Judge William H. Taft has been designated as civil governor. He will remain at the head of the Philippine commission, which is to be continued. An order has also been issued naming General Chaffee as military governor of the archipelago. The military has been ordered to vacate the Ayuntamiento, the large public building which was erected out of the municipal funds of Manila, for government purposes. This will be occupied by the civil officers in the Philippines. The palace of Malacanang, heretofore occupied as headquarters for Generals O'Donnell and MacArthur, has also been ordered vacated by the military authorities, and will be occupied by Governor Taft. The Etatela Mayo, another large public building, is to be the militia headquarters, and will be occupied by General Chaffee when he assumes command.

Judge Bassa, one of the former judges of the court of first instance, is charged with being implicated in frauds in the administration of an estate. Some Magistrate, judge of the court of first instance, for aiding in these frauds was summarily dismissed by the Philippine commission. Some Magellan, another judge of the court of first instance, is charged with malice and incapacity.

Thus three of Manila's four native judges have apparently proved themselves unworthy of confidence, and thus fact is considered to demonstrate the necessity of placing Americans on the bench.

Earl Russell, who was married in Reno, Nev., in 1900, reappeared in the Bow-street police court, London, on the charge of bigamy, and was committed for trial at the central criminal court, and liberated in bail of £2,000.
