

Now, in summer the lower strata of head is truly a beautiful sight. air are warmer than in winter, and therefore clouds are formed at a greater height where conditions are favorable for rapid condensation. The drops falling from these high summer clouds have more time to grow, and therefore become larger than the winter drops.

In winter, as is well known, clouds often exist very near the ground. The velocity with which rain drops fall depends according to Faideau, both on their size and on the wind, which makes them fall obliquely. Other things being equal, a drop of medium size, say one-fiftieth of an inch in diameter, may atrike the ground with a velocity of some 13 feet a second, while a very large drop, measuring one-sixth of an inch, may attain a speed of 38 feet a second.




