Following are the proceedings of the Josephine county court at the adjourned October term:

Board of W. H. Fuller, county assessor elect, approved.

Board of W. F. Kremer, coroner, approved.

C. D. Crane, appointed road supervisor of road district No. 9, in Lucky Queen precinct.

E. F. Hallaway appointed justice of the peace for Selma precinct to fill vacancy.

In the matter of the publication of the delinquent tax roll for the year 1901, the contract was let to the ROGUE RIVER COURIER for publication.

In the matter of bridge petition for over the east fork of the Illinois river by the Walls Smelting & Mining Co., it is ordered that C. F. Lovelace on part of the county confer with T. Wala Morgan Draper of the W. S. & M. company and P. H. Hays of the board of trade and to inspect the proposed site, and it is further ordered that if conditions warrant the building of said bridge C. F. Lovelace is hereby authorized to construct said bridge on part of the county.

In the matter of improving the wagon road between Grants Pass and Waldo, it appearing that the citizens along said road are desirous of an appropriation being made by the county for this purpose and are ready to subscribe to such fund, it is ordered by the court that the county will appropriate an amount equal to what may be raised by subscription, but reserves the privilege of appointing a suitable person to superintend the expenditure of such money.

It was further ordered that the said sheriff proceed to collect the delinquent tax by advertisement and sale, said sale to take place not later than Dec. 20th, 1902.
