The Ashland Tidings has the affrontery in the face of all that has passed, to claim that an apology is due from Grants Pass in regard to what it calls "harsh and unjust criticism" in regard to the episode of the presi dent's visit, saying that General Manager Kruttschnitt had told us that it was at the president's urgent request that the stop was not made. What Kruttschnitt really said was that the train was a complimentary and run in accordance with the wishes of the president, expressed through his secretary and that therefore the S.P. management was not responsible. But neither Kruttschnitt nor the Ashland Tidings nor Dispatcher Morris nor "Assistant Superintendent" O. W. Taylor can condaider us so simple as to believe for an instant that Roose velt or even Loeb troubled himself as to where and when the train tock wood or water or occupied himself in any way with the minor details of the train's management. Those were taken care of by the subordinates of the Southern Pacific as usual, for how could Loeb, even if he wished it. run a train through Southern Oregon otherwise than by their advice and ander their direction as to the minor details? It is well understood throughout Southern Oregon that the reason of the slight was the narrow, contracted and jealous spirit which characterizes the town of Ashland and which has been demon strated lately in other ways besides this. When Grants Pass decided to hold a carnival and had all the details arranged, Ashland arranged for an opposition event. The week before the opening of the carnival, malicious reports of smallpox and diptheria in Grants Pass were circulated in Gold Hill, Sams Valley and Central Point and these reports were started by Ashland parties. The special train for Jackson county visitors to the Grants Pass carnival, and which was under the management of the Ashland train dispatcher, was not allowed to stop at Phoenix, though some 40 peo ple were waiting there to take the train for Grants Pass.
