Must Destroy Cigar Boxes.

Cigar dealers are no longer to be permitted to use empty cigar boxes in their shops which to add to their display of boxes as an advertising scheme. This ruling of the government only applies to empty boxes bearing revenue stamps that have been canceled. Boxes that have never been used and have had no revenue stamp posted on them may be used for display purposes. The government will not allow a cigar box that has had a cigar in it and been stamped with a revenue stamp. The reason for this is that the revenue stamp is placed on the box's end and not on the cigar and if a box could be used a second time a dishonest dealer might try to open the box so as not to notification to revenue stamp and thus repeat its use and avoid the payment of revenue.

To further preclude the possibility of fraud, the government now will have all old boxes destroyed.
