OREGON GRANGE ASK FOR TAX REVISION

They Propose That Telephone, Telegraph and Express Companies Pay More Taxes.

At the recent session of the Oregon State Grange at Forest Grove a resolution was passed authorizing the Grange committee on taxation to prepare a bill to be voted on at the next state election under the initiative act, to tax telephone, telegraph and express companies to the extent of 1 per cent on their gross earnings.

The bill is very sweeping and provides for the annual collection of the tax, same to be paid to the state treasurer, accompanied by a statement of each company or its general manager at the first of each year.

A failure to comply with the law in making reports on payment of tax requires prosecution by the Attorney General and a collection of the money.

Any officer of the companies named being convicted of failure to comply will be subject to a fine of \$250 to \$1000 or imprisonment for 30 days to six months, or both, in the discretion of the court.

The law applies to all corporations of the kind named doing business in Oregon, whether incorporated here or elsewhere. The bill is sure to be placed before the voters at the next general election.
