W. J. Wimer, president and manager of the Deep Gravel Mining Company, operating near Waldo one of the largest placer mines in Southern Oregon, came in from home Saturday to Grants Pass and Sunday he left for San Francisco, where he goes for treatment for an ear trouble.

W. L. Ireland was in Medford and Jacksonville Monday on real estate business. He also when at Jacksonville took a trip to Forest creek to look after a mining property that he and his sister, Miss Minnie Ireland, have in that district. They have two men at work on a tunnel to develop their property, which is showing up well, both in size of the vein and in assay values. The claim is near the Oregon Belle, on which a 10-stamp mill was installed last winter and which is now in successful operation.

Phil Robinson and F. J. Edwards are opening up one of the most promising properties in the Mt. Baldy district. Their claim lies just east of the Grouse Mountain mine, now owned by Peter Larsen, the Spokane millionaire mining man, and from which two shipments of ore, one of a car load and the other of 90 sacks, have lately been made to the Tacoma smelter and from which most flattering returns have been received by Mr. Larsen. Messrs. Robinson & Edwards are now driving a tunnel on the vein to open it up and learn more of its extent. Where they are now working the vein is two feet wide and the ore taken out carries good values, the pay streak being exceptionally rich. All the high grade ore is being sacked for shipment to a smelter and they now have 60 sacks that will assay up in the three figure values. At the rate they are getting out this high grade ore they expect to be able to make a large shipment next month.

GRANTS PASS MISTLETOE FOR RAILWAY OFFICIALS

Generous Quantity Sent to Portland for the Officers of the Harriman Roads.

The railroad officials in the Worcester block in Portland in which is located the general offices for the Harriman roads doing business in this state, which embraces the Southern Pacific, O. R. & N., the Oregon Short Line and the Union Pacific, will have a generous supply of mistletoe for Christmas decorations at their homes. Wednesday a drygoods box, as large as a small house, if the house was not too big, packed to its full capacity with choice mistletoe boughs, was shipped to W. E. Coman, assistant general freight agent of the Oregon Harriman lines, bearing the compliments of H. E. Lonsbury, traveling freight agent for Oregon for the Harriman railroad and steamship lines, and A. B. Cornell, until recently first-trick operator in the Grants Pass Southern Pacific office.

Taking an hour off from his duties of rustling business for his company, while the shippers of Josephine county were pondering over the increasing depth of mud in the wagon roads that was making it a strenuous, blasphemous job to get freight to or from the railroad, Mr. Lonsbury and Mr. Cornell made a trip to one of the oak groves in the outskirts of the city. They took an express wagon along and Mr. Cornell went aloft in the tree tops with the agility of a sailor and cut out the large, choice bunches of mistletoe, which he passed below to Mr. Lonsbury, who stowed cargo. And Mr. Lonsbury was quite as adept in freight handling as he is in freight rustling and he kept shouting for more until Mr. Cornell had denuded a large section of the oak grove of its generous supply of the bough that is so dear to the maiden's heart on Christmas day, and the aforesaid express wagon was so heavily loaded as to be in danger of turning turtle on the homeward trip. Arriving at the depot the freight office boys lent a willing hand, and the biggest drygoods box to be had in the city was procured and soon the largest single consignment of mistletoe that Express Agent Prexley ever sent from Grants Pass was ready for shipment.

Model High School Building.

Klamath Falls now has one of the finest and best arranged high school buildings in Oregon. The building was erected this Fall and was turned over to the school board last week. It will cost when fully furnished about \$40,000.

The building is of brick with concrete basement walls. The basement has a girl's playroom, 33x33, girls' lunchroom, 36x30, boys' playroom 26x36, boys' lunchroom 26x30, and a boys' and a girls' toilet. The remainder will be used for boiler and fuel room, as the building is to be steam heated throughout. The first floor will contain class room, laboratory, principal's office, etc. On the second floor will be the assembly room 45x78 feet, library and other rooms. On the third floor or attic will be a gymnasium 33x78 feet. The roof is of metal. The style of the building is very handsome and the structure is a high compliment to the energy and public spirit of Klamath Falls, which already has a fine graded school building.
