ROGUE RIVER TO BE MADE NAVIGABLE

Little Expense to Open Channel and Open Up New Trade District to Grants Pass

A. Aubrey and Peter Fry returned Monday from a trip down Rogue River to take a boat load of supplies to Russian Charlie Bar, for Capt. J. W. Melnitz and W. L. Montgomery who are operating a placer mine at that place. The boat was an ordinary Rogue river fishing boat and was bought by Capt. Melnitz for use at their mine. The load consisted of tools for a blacksmith shop, rubber boots and clothing, dry goods and camp supplies in all weighing nearly a ton. In addition to this there was 200 feet of lumber. At Galice a raft of 1000 feet of lumber was taken in tow. Including the time to raft the lumber the trip occupied but three days to reach the camp, which is 30 miles below Grants Pass and 15 miles below Galice. Had the river been up to a fair stage and with no raft to retard their progress the boatmen think they could easily have made the trip in one day.

So successful was this venture and so much cheaper than packing in from Leland that Capt. Melnitz is planning to next Fall to boat in all the supplies for their mine. Other mines of that section are also investigating the proposition of getting their supplies and machinery from Grants Pass and shipping in by boat. There are a large number of big placer and quartz mines being opened along Rogue river from Galice to the mouth of Illinois river and a large trade could be had from there for Grants Pass were the river improved so that loaded boats could be readily gotten over the rapids. Mr. Aubrey was raised on the lower Rogue river and fished over every mile of it from Grants Pass to tidewater and he thinks that at a small expense the boatmen could be blasted out and the entire channel cleared so loaded boats could go at any stage of water, except in very high floods, to all parts on the lower river. Messrs. Aubrey & Fry, who are both experienced boatmen, are planning to give up fishing this Spring and then engage in boating supplies and machinery from Grants Pass to the mines, and ranches on the lower river. Mr. Aubrey is confident that it would not take to exceed 500 pounds of giant powder to blast out all the obstructing boulders between Grants Pass and the mouth of the Illinois. He and Mr. Fry will make the proposition next Summer when the water is low so they can be readily done, to the officials of Grants Pass that if they are furnished with the powder and an experienced man to do the blasting that they donate their labor and also boat

themselves and the extra man while doing the work. With the rapids cleared of obstructing boulders an experienced boatman could make the trip even through Hellgate rapids, with comparative security. So confident is Mr. Aubrey that he can take loaded boats down the Rogue river, when the channel is clear, that he has his partner propose, if they take up freighting, to insure their cargoes against loss to the shippers and yet make the freight rate so low that it will be more profitable to the miners to get their supplies from Grants Pass than from Leland and West Fork and pay 1 1/2 to 2 cents a pound for packing in.

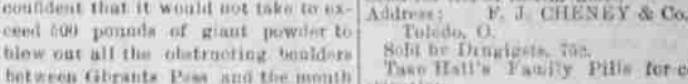
Mr. Aubrey is confident that he could take loaded boat to lower Rogue river in from one to three days, and that the boat could be poled back in not over four days. On their fishing trips he and his partner have poled their heavy fish boat up the river at the rate of 15 to 18 miles a day.

Mr. Aubrey stated to a Courier representative that Capt. Melnitz and his son Frank, and Mr. Montgomery are at their mine, Capt. Melnitz having gone there last week, and they have a crew of men helping them to increase the equipment of the mine. One plant and a small ditch has heretofore been the equipment, but now a second and larger ditch is being constructed and it is expected to have another and a larger giant installed by the last of next week. They then expect to begin piling as there will be an ample supply of water. This mine has been proven to be very rich, but lack of proper equipment has prevented it being worked on an extensive scale. There is every prospect that Capt. Melnitz and Mr. Montgomery will have a fine clean-up next Summer.
