TO BUILD COAST

Is Plan of Southern Pacific-Will Give New Route From Portland to San Francisco.

The Southern Pacific is now giving proof that they intend to build a branch line to their Portland and San Francisco road that will leave the main line at Drain and go down the Umpqua river to near the mouth of that stream and thence down the coast by way of Marshfield, Crescent City and Eureka to San Francisco. A survey for this route was completed last year, but the records were burned in the San Francisco fire this Spring and now the Company is having the line run over again. A large party of surveyors began work at Drain three weeks ago setting grade stakes and other parties are being put in the field on other sections of the line. Of work of resurveying the line and setting grade stakes in Del Norte and Curry county the Crescent City Record has the following to say: "A crew of 17 Southern Pacific railroad surveyors arrived on the steamer Del Norte, Monday and Thursday they left for Carry county to begin re-running lines southward to the Klamath river in this county.

"This crew will make a re-survey of 3 00 about 30 miles north and south of the State line, as all the papers pertaining to the survey made last Summer were destroyed in the San Francisco fire last April. A portion of the route in the southwestern part of this county is very rough, being mountainous and covered with a dense growth of large

redwood trees. "Another crew is engaged in runniag lines in Coos and Curry counties, Oregon, to make connection with the line through this county. The crew that arrived here will proceed as far north as Whale's Head, in Curry county, and from there go over the line southerly as far south as the Klamath river in this county. Reports of the work done south of the Klamath not having been turned into headquarters before the fire it will not be necessary to go over that portion of the survey.

This coast route will be rather expensive to build owing to the great number of bridges that, will be re quired across the numbers of rivers and creeks that put tinto he ocean and there will be a large amount of cuts and tunnels to be made to get through the divides that separate the valleys. The route though can be made practically level with no heavy grades, the heaviest being said not to exceed one per cent.

Just what effect the opening of this line to San Francisco will have on the traffic of the main line through Southern Oregon is a matter that is of concern to Grants Pass and the 45 00 other towns of this section. It is quite certain that the heavy through freight trains will be sent over the Coast route, and the novelty of riding along for miles in sight of the ocean Will cause 38 49 route. The building of this coast line and the giving of an outlet to Cres-2 95 cent City and to the timber of Del 1 45 Norte county and the copper mines of the Preston Peak district will be a serious handicap on the getting of a railroad built from Grants Pass to Crescent City or any point on the cast. With a nearby railroad along the coast and a down hill haul from the sawmill and mines for the branch lines there would be no likelihood of those interests aiding in the construction or of giving traffic to roads to Grants Pass. The fact is Grants Pass has neglected its opportunities and let the time slip by for getting a railroad to the coast. Had the venture been taken up with vigor even two or three years ago this city could have secured substantial inducements 6 10 to its coast railroad ventures from the 7 00 trade that could have been had on its completion. Had the Spokane spirit been manifested and when one promotion plan failed rostle around and 5 30 try another the chances are that by this time construction work wold at least be begun on Grants Pass' rail-road that is just now a very uncertain matter.
