UNION WAR CENTURED

LABOR LEADER DECLARES WAR AMONG RIVAL UNIONS IN CHICAGO.

Chicago, Oct. 24-President Samu-I Gompers of the American Federation of Labor was asked yesterday by leading Chicago manufacturers to compel local unions to cease fighting among themselves. If this fighting was not stopped, he was told, the "open shop" would be established in the large woodworking factories of the city.

The case was put plainly to Mr. Gompers. He was informed that either the unions must ablde ov their written contracts and conduct themselves peaceably, or else a great lockout, which may involve as many as for a visit to the new city of Gary. 6,000 or 7,000 skilled factory workers, will follow.

After receiving the committee Mr. Gompers admitted they were in the right and declared that union strife must stop at once. The labor leader left for Lafayette.

Ind., where he promised to confer with President Hubert of the Interna tional Brotherhood of Carpenters,one of the organizations involved in the controversy.

The committee which waited on President Gompers consisted of President B. E. Bensinger of the Bruns wick-Balke-Collender Company, Oscar Bauer of the Liquid Carbonic Company and J. H. Hanley of A. H. Revell & Co. All are members of the Wood Working Manufacturers' Association, which comprises practically all the large factories in Chicago.

Pure Food Law Endorsed.

New York, Oct. 24 .- The rules and regulations to govern the enforcement of the pure food law seem to give general satisfaction. This is certainly the case if views expressed yesterday after a superficial reading by various representatives of branches of business affected are true indi eations.

Confectionery interests are per haps the most disappointed, as the regulations fail to give information for which they have been waiting, namely, what coloring matter they may legally use.




