FRUIT GROWERS MEETING IN GRANTS PASS

Best in Interest and Largest in Attendance of Any Ever Held in Rogue River Valley.

(Continued from last week.)

Prof. Claude I. Lewis, horticulturist at the Oregon Agricultural College, gave at the forenoon session a highly instructive address on "How to Plant and Cultivate an Orchard to Make It Profitable." Prof. Lewis is one of the new men on the College staff coming last Spring from the New York Agricultural College and he is a graduate of Cornell University. His very practical addresses the answers he gave to the many questions asked him proved that he was thoroughly up-to-date on every phase of orchard work, and the instructions he gave were highly appreciated by the fruit growers. Manager Meserve of the Union had secured from A. I. Mason, the well known Hood River orchardist his box press and it arrived in Grants Pass last Saturday and was taken to the court house together with some boxes of apples contributed by A. T. Martin, of this city. With these Prof. Lewis gave a demonstration in apple packing, showing the packs and most approved methods that are used by the Hood River and other progressive fruit raisers.

Profs. Cordley and Lewis were the leading speakers on the program but during the day short addresses were given by prominent business men of Grants Pass and by leading orchardists that were to the point and added much to the interest and the educational features of the sessions. County Judge Stephen Jewell spoke on the enforcement of the laws for eradicating the pests and he clearly showed that it would be a money making proposition to the tax payers of Josephine county to aid in building up the fruit industry through the county employing a fruit inspector to make careless growers free their trees of pests and to enforce the quarantine laws as to prevent the introduction of new pests. L. L. Jewell, president of the Grants Pass Commercial Club and cashier of the Grants Pass Banking & Trust Co., made a clear presentation of the assistance that the business men of Grants Pass could give to the development of the fruit

industry of this Valley and of the consequent increase in trade and wealth it would bring to the city. L. B. Hall, president of the First National Bank of Southern Oregon in giving a business man's views of the work of fruit growers unions stated that through a union was the most profitable way to market fruit and the most economical method of purchasing the necessary supplies required in the industry, as also the union would be a powerful factor in securing the enforcement of the laws to eradicate the pests. That the fruit industry would become the chief factor in the wealth of Josephine county was clearly shown in the address made by H. L. Gilkey, cashier of the First National Bank of Southern Oregon. Mr. Gilkey predicted that the mines, the dairy, the timber and the water power would each be a great factor in making Josephine one of the most prosperous counties in Oregon but owing to the vast acreage of fine fruit land the orchard would lead all in the wealth returned. In telling how he and his brother Fred D. Eisman had sold this Fall \$14,000 worth of marketable apples from a 35 acre orchard Christopher Eisman gave a talk on practical orchard work that was very instructive and appreciated by all present. That it is as essential for the fruit raiser to advertise as it is for the merchant was shown by H. C. Bobzien, the well known merchant of this city and a fruit raiser. To the persistent advertising carried on by Hood River Mr. Bobzien attributed as one cause for that progressive district making the world's record each year for their fruit, and the lack of advertising was one of the reasons Rogue River apples do not equal Hood River apples in price as they do in quality. Rogue River is able to hold the world's record for high price for pears and the growing of this fruit is becoming a leading industry of the Valley, but it is threatened with ruin by the blight that is now making havoc in the pear orchards of the East and in California, Washington and Eastern Oregon. Willard Chase who recently moved here from California told of the almost fruitless efforts of the California orchardists to eradicate the blight from their pear trees and he cautioned the fruit growers of Rogue River Valley to guard against the introduction of this deadly pest, for it would end pear growing. J. H. Robinson, the well known orchardist and nurseryman of Wilderville made a comprehensive statement of the various ways that a union is of benefit to fruit raisers. Owing to the bad condition of roads of Josephine county

hauling fruit to the railroad is a slow and expensive matter. That with turnpike roads the farmers could get their fruit to market at from 25 to 50 per cent cheaper than is now possible was the point E. N. Provolt, an Appleite fruit raiser, made in his address.

There were several other persons on the program most of whom asked to be excused, not being used to public speaking. H. E. Lounsbury and John P. Jones both of Portland, the former district freight agent and the latter traveling freight agent of the Southern Pacific, had planned to attend the fruit growers meeting but pressing business kept them in Portland and each sent his best wishes for the success of the meeting and for the building up of the fruit industry in Rogue River Valley.

NOT HEN'S FAULT IF EGGS ARE SCARCE

Keep Her Warm, Dry and Happy and She Will Lay All Winter, Says an Expert.

Hens will lay eggs in Oregon all winter, says J. W. Bailey, State Food and Dairy Commissioner, if they are hatched right, fed right and kept happy. Their happiness, he declares, is the most necessary condition, and this can be attained only by keeping them dry and warm.

"There's no good excuse for a scarcity of eggs in Oregon," he declared.

"Hatch chickens in March in incubators, and keep them out of the rain and the cold next winter and they will lay," and tells of a man named Tucker in Jefferson, Or., who, from 24 hens, has been gathering 18 and 20 eggs a day this month.

"Mr. Tucker," continued Mr. Bailey, "hatched his chickens last March, and now, in their laying period, keeps them protected from the weather. He doesn't allow them to run round in the wet and the cold. They have dry living quarters, comfortable like his own. They don't shiver in a wet barnyard, nor steam in fence corners nor under an old shed."

"Large numbers of farmers neglect their chickens or give them poor care, and the result is scarcity of eggs. They need to wake up to business. The old idea that Oregon winters are too wet for laying is exploded. The hens can be kept out of the wet."

Medium weight hens are best for winter eggs, says Mr. Bailey, such as Plymouth Rocks, Wyandottes or Rhode Island Reds. Careful attention to breeding must be given, as in building up milk cows in the dairy. Just as cows that yield little milk should be culled from the dairy, so hens that lay few eggs should give place to larger producers.

An indispensable aid to such work is in the keeping of a daily record of each hen, so that the lagging fowls can be picked out from the busy ones. —Oregonian.

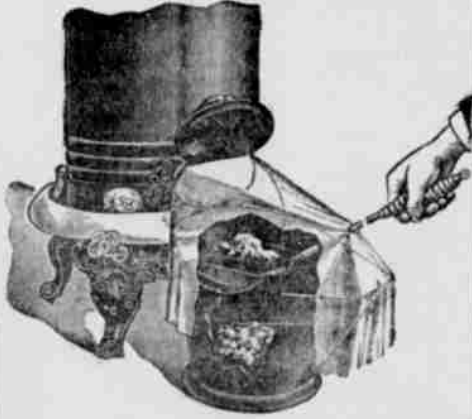

The elbow draft casting with its upward slant allows the empty coal hole to be set under the draft so that no ashes or coals can be spilled on the floor. Our patented dustless ash cover shown by illustration is furnished free with Nos. 122, 132, 142 and 156 Hot Blast Coal Stoves. It keeps down every particle of dust in removing ashes, a feature that will be appreciated by every tidy housekeeper. Ashes are only removed once in 2 months from the Air-Tight Wood Stoves as the dustless ash cover is not necessary. Ash pans when used in other stoves are too small to hold a full 24 hours' accumulation of ashes. They are usually overflowed when removed, and the ashes in the bottom of the stove are dragged out on to the carpet as shown by cut No. 2. You are all familiar with the ash pan method, and have, no doubt, gone through the

process many times of spreading a newspaper or cloth under your stove every time the over-filled pan is removed. The ash pan is not only dirty, but is a great evil in stove construction. It adds a door and joints which can be made only temporarily airtight by the use of stove putty. 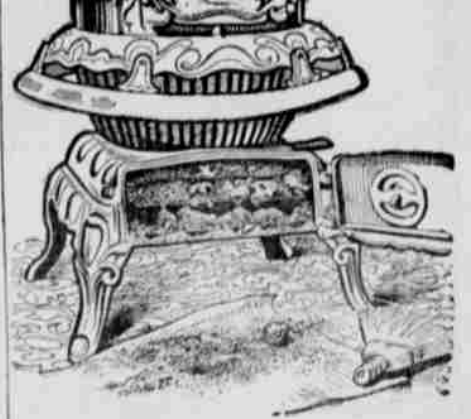

The feed door on these stoves is smoke proof, and does away with the escape of smoke, soot and gas into the house.

Side feed doors used on other stoves discharge a cloud of gas and soot-laden smoke into the house and scatter soot and ashes over the carpet when opened. Another point: In feeding coal into a side feed door it has to be thrown into the stove, which usually results in scattering much of it over the floor. With our cleanly smoke proof feed door the coal is poured into our Hot Blast Coal Stove even to the dust in the bottom of the hod without a particle being spilled on the floor. The top feed door on Cole's Original Air-Tight Wood Stoves are smoke proof and safe.
