The Pellet well is an 8-inch well 805 feet deep When first driven the flow was 500 gallons per minute but this flow decreased in the latter part of the Sammer. The formation which the Pure Food Law. they drilled through was principally shale and no casing was used except for the upper 20 feet. Mr. Pellet capped the well and laid a 2-inch pipe to his house about a qurter of a mile distant. This probably tended to lessen the flow. The water is rather warm and has a decided mineral raste. Through the Summer season Mr. Pellet also uses this water to irrigate his apple and pear orchrd of which he says there is an ample sopply. A weir measurement of the discharge from the well was made Febbe flowing about 240,000 or 250,000 gallons per day.
