Generally speaking, all rates east of the Missouri river will be on a basts of two cents per mile, while to all points rest of these rates will be reduced to the difference between the present basing rate and the new basing rate in effect next Friday. The reduction of interstate fares by the Western lines is the natural result of the passige of laws by Arkansas, Missouri, Nebraska, Illinois, Iowa and Minneseta. The Eastern roads propose to make similar reductions in their interstate fares. Their rate clerks will meet here today and continue in sesgen until they have "checked up" all the interstate fares on the basis of the maximum legal mileage of the rarious States.
