DOINGS AT THE COURT HOUSE

Items of Interest to the Taxpayers of Josephine County From the Various County Officials

Reward for McCumber.

"Jim" McCumber, the erstwhile jail bird who made his escape from the Josephine county jail one quiet Sunday afternoon, recently, by sawing off one of the heavy iron bars by means of a case knife, which he had made into a file, is still conspicuous for his absence and Sheriff Russell wants to know of his whereabouts. The fellow is one of those professional criminals and has been in the toils of the law before and if he can help it, he does not propose to be sent up to the state penitentiary this time for "rolling" a drunk at Leland and "touching" him for the sum of \$10. Sheriff Russell offers a reward of \$25 to any person who will furnish information, leading to the arrest of the fellow. McCumber may have left this part of the country for good, although he was seen prowling around the neighborhood of Leland, where his last known crime was committed. If caught he will be summarily dealt with and will doubtless find himself behind the state prison bars, where he seems to rightfully belong.

School Clerks Negligent

County School Superintendent Savage is making arrangements for his tour of annual inspection of the schools of Josephine county, as he is required by law to make. But in planning for the trip he finds that he is not sure about some of the schools holding school, as the clerks of certain districts have entirely failed to comply with the law in the matter of filing with the county superintendent copies of their contracts with the teachers they may have employed. This is a matter of much importance and some school clerks may find that they have made a big mistake in not thus complying with the law governing such matters. Superintendent Savage hopes those officials who have not attended to this matter will proceed to do so at their earliest possible opportunity.

Tenant Officers Named.

In the rush of fair and convention matter in last issue the Courier made a few errors in reporting the names of tenant officers appointed to do duty in Josephine county. One was in district No. 27, (Wolf Creek) school, the name given as F. E. Logan and it should have been T. E. Loban. In district No. 23, Winifred Savage is the person intended and not Winifred Sage.
