The first annual Rogue River Valley Poultry show was held last week com mencing Thursday and continuing through Saturday. This, the first effort of the poultry men was a revelation to the people of this section who have not looked upon the poultry business as of much importance as yet.

The show was held in the recently completed warehouse of Cramer Brothers back of their store, the use of which was denated by the firm. There were 53 coops of birds on exhibit, one from Asbland, one from College Place, Wash, and the balance from within the county.
