NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS.
The tax rolls for 1908 are now in my hands and I am ready to collect all taxes on personal and realty. Attend to this matter at once and thus avoid having to pay extra penalty as will be the case if you allow the same to become delinquent. Up to March 15, there will be a discount of 3 per cent. The penalty may be avoided by the payment of one-half the tax before April 6 and the balance can remain unpaid until October 1. If half is not paid by October 1, then a penalty of 1 per cent will be added. If none is paid and the tax allowed to go delinquent, then a penalty of 10 per cent will be added April 6 and interest at the rate of 1 per cent per month will be added.
