SEMI-MONTHLY MEETING**

The Womens Relief Corps, Gen.  
Logan No. 25, held their regular semi-  
monthly meeting in their rooms at M.  
W. O. W. Hall on Front street, Satur-  
day afternoon, March 28, President  
Mrs. Goodnow in the chair. A large  
membership was present at both  
meetings.

The reports of the different commit-  
tees show earnest and faithful work  
has been done. The sustained interest  
manifested by the corps in this special  
line of work is most commendable.  
Secretary Mrs. Hildreth read a com-  
munication from Gov. Chamberlain to  
Mrs. Cora M. Davis, Department presi-  
dent, regarding the soldiers home at  
Roseburg, complaints having been  
made to Mrs. Davis concerning the  
inmates of the Home. Gov. Chamber-  
lain made a personal investigation as  
to existing conditions. The governor  
not only interviewed the old men  
themselves, but the citizens of Rose-  
burg and found general satisfaction  
with reference to the management of  
the Home. He says the Home is well  
kept. The old men are comfortably  
clad and well cared for. Their daily  
food is better than is found on the  
table of 90 per cent of our citizens.  
He thinks it a serious mistake that  
no provisions were made for furnishing  
rations for the wife of the old  
soldier. He has taken up the subject  
with Mr. Elder and hopes an arrange-  
ment may be made to pay cash value  
of a ration, instead of furnishing the  
rations in kind. He also requested the  
commandant to secure skilled nurses  
so that at all times the sick shall have  
as good care as is possible to receive  
in the best appointed hospital in the  
state. A generous sum was subscribed  
by the members of this corps as a free-  
will offering to "The Lincoln Farm  
association" which President Roosevelt  
expects to dedicate to the American  
people on February 12, 1909, the Cen-  
tenary of Abraham Lincoln.

Both officers and members are well  
pleased with the work that has been  
done by this corps for the first quarter  
of 1908. All requests and obligations  
whether national, department or  
local, have been promptly met and  
many new features added in a social  
way. At the close of the business  
hour a short literary and musical pro-  
gram was given which was enjoyed by  
all. Light refreshments were then  
served, which has become a social  
custom with the corps. Thus closed  
another pleasant and profitable day  
in the Womens Relief Corps.
