GRANITE LANDS MAKE THE BEST GARDENS

Wilfred Harris, a native of England who came to America some three years ago and has been a resident of West Grants Pass for the past two years, was the first to market green peas last season and again this season. He brought in the first mess the 20th of May this season. He started his garden two years ago on purely granite soil. He has recently decided to go into gardening on a larger scale—his vocation in the mother country—and after the two last seasons here is fully convinced that granite gives far the best results.

Mr. Harris as well as others who have been here longer say that the granite soil gets warm earlier in the season and will, therefore, produce an earlier garden than the other soils. Another point in favor of the granite is that it will produce a large crop of vegetables, strawberries and other small fruits where some of the other soils would have to be irrigated. As evidence of his claims Mr. Harris has pea vines in his granite garden four feet tall at the present time.

Those who have inclined to the opinion that the granite soil is worthless will do well to take notice of Mr. Harris' garden. A small investment in the same kind of soil will bring them handsome returns either as an investment or in an increase in the value of the land within a few years.

OREGON BUILDING FOR EXPOSITION UNDER WAY

Will Be Largest and Most Complete at Alaskan-Yukon-Pacific Exposition.

A letter from the president of the Alaskan-Yukon-Pacific exposition which is to be held at Seattle next year, states that the Oregon building, which is to be the largest and most complete state building on the grounds, is now under construction and will be completed in due time for the exposition.

It is the purpose of the commission to have a collective exhibit of the resources of the state by counties. As the exposition opens in June of next year the exhibit will have to be made up from the various crops of 1908. The president has suggested the necessity of gathering this exhibit early. After the county exhibit has been thus gathered the commission will transport it to Seattle, install and maintain it, without expense to the county. Josephine county should have one of the best exhibits in the Oregon building. It will only cost the gathering of the best specimens of our various resources, which, however, should be done with regard for quality rather than quantity.

The commission is also having printed a 96-page booklet on the resources of Oregon to be distributed during the exposition. Two pages of this booklet will be devoted to each county, and Grants Pass and Josephine county should co-operate with the exposition people to the end that we get the very best utility out of the two pages allotted to Josephine county.
