Arrangements have been completed for the gathering of the boys of 61-'65 to pitch their tents here and to enjoy for a few days the hospitality of the people of Central Point.

The tenting grounds will be in the beautiful grove at the old fair grounds just west of town, and the occasion is expected to be one of the best enjoyed by the veterans in recent years.

The Southern Oregon organization comprises some 300 veterans of the civil war days and with their friends and families who will attend it is expected there will be well nigh 1000 persons in attendance at the coming encampment.

Members of the local post as well as all citizens of the town will have nothing undone to make pleasant the stay of the honored guests who upheld the old flag during the troublous times of the early '60's.—Central Point Herald.

Chicago, July 27.—Since the low prices of 1907 there has been an appreciation of \$2,514,663,750 in 175 stocks. Of these securities, 97 are railroads, 65 industrial and 13 copper. The railroads show an increase in security values amounting to more than \$1,195,000. In this appreciation Harriman and his friends have been noteworthy participants. In the case of Union Pacific, which has a capital stock of \$195,500,000, there has been an advance from \$100 a share to \$155 1/2 or 55 1/2 points. Among railroads this advance in points holds the record. The Standard Oil crowd and Mr. Harriman are also credited with a large interest in United States Steel stocks. Amalgamated Copper and Illinois Central shares. United States Steel common has advanced from 21 1/2 the low mark of last year, to 45 1/2, the current high price. This is a gain of 24 points and \$122,040,000 in market value.
