GOOD WAY TO GET RID OF BIG FIR STUMP

A farmer who has had much experleace in getting rid of fir stumps, tells in a recent issue of the Pacific Homest-ad of the way he accomplished the best results. Many Courier readers are now clearing preparatory to plant vacation and eggs are bringing a good doubtedly be interested in what the writer has to say, which is as follows:

"To begin with I will sav that any good strong man can get rid of an old fir stump, six or eight feet in diameter, with an outlay of not more than two hours' work and there will not be a root of it left that a plow will touch in plowing the ground where it stood. Now, you must do the work in the months of July, Angust or September, or, if the stumps are not more than two feet through, the first half of October will do. These statements apply to all stumps that have been cut two years or longer (not groen stumps).

It will burn from a few days to two months or even a little longer owing to the size of the stump. A heavy rain will not interfere with the burning as the dirt being hot causes the rain to evaporate as fast as it falls keeping the stump d.y.

"By keeping the heat confined as above described the generated gas will burn the roots several feet in the ground.

"I burned a great lot of fir stumps in this way three years ago. Two years. ago I burned seventy-five. Last year I burned about thirty.
