Public Instruction a circular of in-
formation which will be of interest
to those wishing to take the fall ex-
aminations, which will be held in the
court house beginning August 10.

Mercury Curing Tuberculosis.
Surgeon Wright, of the navy, re-
ports in the New York Medical
Journal that all of the ten men who
have been under the mercury treat-
ment for tuberculosis have been
either cured or greatly improved,
while of the two who did not take
the treatment one is failing and one
is improving but slowly.

A Governor in Brown Jeans.
On the 26th, at Atlanta, "Little
Joe" Brown, dressed in a suit of
brown jeans produced and made in
Georgia, walked to the State Capitol
and took the oath as governor in
place of Hoke Smith. The coldness
between the two men was relaxed
only slightly.

Police Case Stirrs New York.
Not in years has the political cur-
rent of New York City been so deep-
ly stirred as it is just now over the
outcome of what is known as the
"Duffy case." Upon the determined
appeal of Justice William J. Gaynor,
Mayor McClellan had given a personal
hearing as to the alleged illegal
arrest and photographing of a
Brooklyn boy named George Duffy
after Police Commissioner Bingham
had refused to alter the record. On
Wednesday the mayor virtually took
personal charge of the police depart-
ment by disposing of high officers
over Bingham's head, and thus vir-
tually demanding his resignation; at
the same time ordering the return of
the photographs to the boy's father.
Justice Gaynor is made extremely
popular by his vindication, and is
more talked of as a coming national
figure in the Democratic party and
as a candidate for mayor. He hails
the McClellan decision as "the begin-
ning of the restoration of free gov-
ernment to the great and intelligent
city of New York," and says that in
the person of this weak and unin-
fluential milk boy "that there is no
place in our system of government
for an autocrat."
