The meeting of the stockholders will be held at Medford April 16, at 11 a. m., to elect directors and adopt by-laws, and to attend to any further business.

This association will undoubtedly have the support of all the large fruit growers in the valley and it should have the help of every small fruit raiser, as he will be much more benefited than the party who ships

Grants Pass shipped about a dozen cars of fruit last year and the whole valley expects to ship 800 cars this year. It behooves us to get into the large association and be helped by the large shippers, who realized about twice as much as the small ones last year.

The fruit growers of this valley must be united to properly advertise, grade, pack uniformly and, lastly, sell the fruit right.
