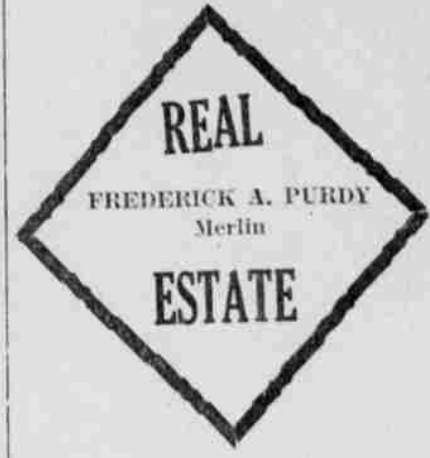

### WOMAN IS ARRESTED FOR LOS ANGELES CRIME

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 19.—Following the arrest of Mrs. Belle Lavin, living at Twenty-second and Mission streets, on a charge of being a fugitive from justice, but in reality in connection with the dynamiting of the Los Angeles Times building, the authorities today refuse to say whether other arrests will follow immediately.

The arrest of Mrs. Lavin was made on the strength of a warrant issued by Justice Summerfield of Los Angeles, together with four others which are now in the hands of Detective W. J. Burns and Earl Rogers.

Mrs. Lavin's arrest took place last night after Chief Seymour had lost all patience at her apparently contradictory statements regarding the actions of "Smithy," the alleged dynamiter, who lived at the Twenty-second and Mission streets house. Mrs. Lavin protested her innocence vigorously before being placed aboard the train for Los Angeles, where her testimony will be taken before the coroner.

"It's a mistake," she cried. "I am wholly innocent of any connection with this terrible crime."

Graf Baber, who left Grants Pass last Wednesday, October 12, came near being one of the victims of the Shaniko fire which destroyed nearly all of the business section of that little town early Friday morning. Graf was on his way to Prineville and was to stop over one day in Biggs and two days at Shaniko. On reaching Biggs he became slightly indisposed and thought he had better go on to Shaniko without delay in order to be near a physician. He arrived at the latter town Thursday evening and retired about 11 o'clock and was awakened early next morning by the roar of burning timbers and found the building in flames. The smoke was so dense and suffocating that he had difficulty in getting out of his room, he having barely time to gather his clothing and run under the flames. An account of this fire was published in Friday's Daily Courier. The man who perished in the flames occupied the next room to Mr. Baber.

### BIG FRUIT BUSINESS

WALLA WALLA, Oct. 18.—Officers of the Milton Fruit Growers' union expect that the union will do a total business of a quarter of a million of dollars this season. At present it has \$40,000 in the bank to the credit of orchardists, \$70,000 has been checked out in the past three weeks and earlier receipts and those yet to come will bring the total well above the \$300,000 mark, according to Manager Lamb of the union. This is about three times the business done by the union last year and it is not nearly what is expected.

A. Morrison this week sold to Irvin Paul, a recent arrival from Michigan, his 200-acre farm three miles south of this city, receiving \$6000 cash for the place. The place is adapted for general farming and contains about six acres of orchard. Water from the springs nearby is piped around the house, making it very convenient for irrigation purposes, as well as for use in the house. The purchaser, Mr. Paul, has also taken a quarter section adjacent to the property just purchased. Mr. Morris owns 10 acres two miles from town on the Merlin road, where he expects to locate this winter.

### PROF. O'GARA LIKES THE ILLINOIS VALLEY

Professor P. J. O'gara, Jackson county's pathologist, came down Sunday and visited with A. N. Parsons. During the day a trip was made to the Birchard and Parson's orchard in the Applegate, which the professor thoroughly inspected.

He was delighted with the work done and with the development planned and gave his advice as to the proper planting and care of the orchard. Last year in the spring thirty-five acres were set out to trees under his supervision. Ten acres were set to apples, fifteen to pears and ten to peaches. Twenty acres will be set out this fall to pears.

Professor O'gara expressed the opinion that the Applegate valley was ideally located for the growing of fruit because of its drainage and protection from high winds.
