GRANTS PASS GIRL WINNING MUSICAL FAME

Miss Eula Howard, whose concert announcement appears among "The Examiner" musical advertisements today, is having a brilliantly successful season and has been compelled to refuse several flattering engagements offered to her. Alfred Metzger, the critical editor of the Musical Review, said of her last week:

"Miss Eula Howard, the petite 'Princess of the Piano,' as she has been called, is to give a recital at Century hall on Wednesday evening, November 30. This will be an event of more than ordinary interest, on account of the phenomenal success attained by this young concert performer. Just now she is playing in Oregon, and last month she appeared in Santa Barbara, filling unsolicited engagements at rates so satisfactory that she was mentioned in some of the papers as the 'Dollar-a-Minute Pianist.'

"The Musical Review was first to recognize the splendid technical ability and high musical intelligence of Miss Howard, and it is pleasant to see that the prophecies then made concerning her are being fulfilled. She is the most petite of professional pianists, and on that account her audiences are astonished at the technique she displays and at her maturity of understanding. WILLIAMS MAKES REPLY TO ATTORNEY IRWIN

Grants Pass, Ore., Nov. 11, 1910. Editor of Courier: I notice in last Sunday's issue of your paper an article written by H. D. Irwin, of Chicago, Ill., attorney for Sanders and a few of the minority stockholders of the Golden Drift Mining company, which treats largely upon a question involved in an action at law between a few of the minority stockholders, who are represented by Geo. E. Sanders, and the majority stockholders.

The article refers at length to negotiations between myself, representing the Rogue River Irrigation & Power company, and the minority stockholders, which were partially negotiated through Mr. Irwin, but many interviews were had with Mr. A. E. Strock and Mr. P. Phillip, who are leading members of the so-called minority stockholders. Several of the interviews with all of the above named gentlemen were co-operated in with me by W. T. Reed, of Kansas City, who, it will be remembered, is a large real estate holder in the valley and who was very much interested in bringing about some amicable arrangement whereby water could be secured for 1911.

I feel complimented indeed by Mr. Irwin in his reference to having offered to let me invest \$500 with them, which I declined. This, I believe, showed good judgment on my part, and is corroborated by the people of the entire valley, inasmuch as an invitation has been extended to everybody, not only of Grants Pass but the farming community, in which they have been invited to invest anywhere from 25 cents to \$25,000. So far as I am able to learn, no one has availed themselves of this golden opportunity.

And further, I wish to say that the Rogue River Irrigation & Power company will co-operate with any one who will reconstruct the old dam and put it in such physical condition that water may be furnished therefrom for irrigation purposes for the season of 1911.
