SEATTLE, May 31 .- Having completed and sworn in the jury, the fourth. opening statement of the prosecution examining one witness, everything was ready for a day of testimony in the C. W. Wappenstein case, but the court granted a holiday. Evidence taken formally will begin tomorrow.
