NORTH YAKIMA PEOPLE BUY NEAR THIS CITY

One of the interesting sales of real estate of the past week was consummated by Judge H. H. Basler, the property being the Hurlburt tract of 16 1/2 acres located one mile west of the city on the river road.

The purchaser was Frank Smith, a business man of North Yakima, Wash. The property is one of the most valuable in Rogue River valley, and the deal speaks volumes for Southern Oregon climate and soil when Washington residents purchase property here.

The ranch is one of the show places around Grants Pass and from its trees Spitzenberg apples were obtained that captured first prize at Ashland two years ago, leading a large number of exhibits from the valley. The ranch contains five acres of one-year-old new towns, also a few bartlett pears. The soil is a rich alluvial bottom land, and the location is ideal, being on one of the permanent drives down the valley. Prof. E. R. Hurlburt of the city schools has been the resident manager of the property and it is in keeping to mention that the orchard has a fine crop of fruit. The tract will be under the gravity ditch irrigation system. The consideration was around \$10,000.

Mr. and Mrs. Smith will make their permanent home here.
