M. DO YOUR FALL SPRAYING NOW, SAYS INSPECTOR

The time for fall spraying has arrived. Everyone who has a tree or shrub should spray thoroughly now with Bordeaux mixture, before the fall rains set in. Do not wait for the leaves to fall.

As soon as your fruit is off the trees use this spray. In each case use 6-6-50 strength, and don't forget your gooseberries and currant bushes. A good application of spray now will mean a great deal to young orchards next year, while if you put it off till next month the rains will have begun and your work will not be so efficient.

I am glad to report that blight is pretty well cleaned up in this vicinity, but you should not fail to keep a sharp watch on your orchard, because if there are hold over cases left it will mean worry, expense and loss for you next year, so examine your orchards frequently.

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JACKSON COUNTY WILL BUILD GOOD ROADS

Special to The Courier.

MEDFORD, Oct. 9.—Jackson county is proceeding with the matter of arrangements to build good roads as a result of the recent favorable vote in the county to issue \$1,500,000 in bonds, as the law under which the bonds were voted is considered all sufficient.

Attorney Evan Reames of this city was a member of the state judiciary commission, and while at work on that board Attorney Reames put the matter of the soundness of the law up to the other members and the unanimous opinion was that the counties of Oregon could proceed legally with voting bonds for good roads, and that county courts had ample authority to call elections for such purposes.

In Jackson county the county court acted without even a petition the court calling the election on its own volition.

Asphalt will not hinder the bond issue. It is now stated, and the bonds will be purchased. It is the belief here, however, that the bond firm which purchases the paper, may test the law in a friendly way.
