| planted as an experiment on one of our common serpentine barrens upon which none of our native specles thrive or produce stands of timber of a merchantable nature. <br> Cedrus deodora is a forest tree native to India and is introduced into this country for its botauical interests, and also because it is such an excellent timber tree in its native habitat. <br> Forest planting will be confined principally to our three most valuable trees, namely, sugar and yellow pine and Douglas fir. Practically every bushy mountain slope where conditions are at all favorable for tree growth is suitable for growing either one or a comblation of these three trees. <br> On the Siskiyou National forest there are approximately three acres of light scattered timber and brush to one acre of commerclal timber. However, notwithstanding thls low ratio of commercial timber acreage, there are roughly estimated to be $14,000,000,000$ feet, board measure, of merchantable timber. <br> The ultimate goal to be reached in the management of a national forest must be to make every acre highly productive. A national forest can be thought of as a "tree factory" where lumber is grown in the rough. As a factory then, it should turn out its product at its full capacity. <br> By the gradual ellmination of the fire danger, by protecting and favoring stands of natural young growth, and by planting nursery grown trees or by sowing tree seed on the denuded areas that have little chance of being restocked naturally, it is hoped to eventually double the estimate of merchantable timber. This would mean the doubling of the annual yield which in round numbers would be $300,000,000$ feet, board measure, of merchantable timber. <br> Even with our present no more than half normal forest, there is sufficlent mature timber and new growth coming in to guarantee a sustalned annual yield of at least 125,000,000 feet, board measure. This at an average stumpage rate of $\$ 2$ (which is undoubtedly lower than the rate we will realize when the demand becomes sufficiently great to make the timber areas accessible) means an annual return to the gov- | ernment for stumpage of $\$ \mathbf{2 5 0 , 0 0 0}$ and a revenue to the community in the shape of wages of at least $\$ 8$ per thousand, or a total per annum of $\$ 1,000,000$. <br> I.
