HOUSTON, Texas, May 28.—Woodrow Wilson men are in complete control of the democratic state convention which met here at noon today. It was predicted that the New Jersey man will get at least 32 district delegates and eight delegates at large.

There are 623 votes in the convention, of which Wilson controls considerably more than half, with Judson Harmon second and Champ Clark third.

The success of the Wilson ticket is considered a blow politically to Senator Bailey, who stumped the state against Wilson's candidacy. United States Senator Culberson will lead the Wilson delegates.

TORNADO KILLS FOURTEEN.

TULSA, Okla., May 28.—The town of Skiatook, 15 miles north of here, was wrecked by a tornado this afternoon, 14 persons killed and many injured, according to reports received here. The village of Fairfax is also reported badly damaged by a tornado.

BLACKWELL, Okla., May 28.—One man is dead and thousands of dollars' worth of crops and buildings destroyed today as a result of a hail-storm which swept the country north of here. Perry Neaby was instantly killed when he was struck on the head by a hailstone. A tornado followed the hail.

LORIMER ILL, WANTS ACTION IN SENATE DELAYED.

WASHINGTON, May 28.—Telegraphing from Chicago, Senator Lorimer today asked a member of the Lorimer investigating committee and one of the members who signed a minority report hostile to Lorimer, that consideration of the movement to expel Lorimer from the senate be deferred until his health had improved. Lea responded that consideration of the matter could not be delayed, but that no action would be taken until Lorimer had presented his defense.
