SIDELIGHTS ON THE REPUBLICAN CONVENTION.

A sensation was caused at this time by the announcement that the Wisconsin delegation had decided to vote for Governor McGovern of that state for temporary chairman. This was a distinct acquisition to the Roosevelt forces, as the Wisconsin delegation had heretofore refused point blank to consider any amalgamation whatever with the Roosevelt people.

As the hour for calling the convention to order drew near, the delegates began to climb on to their chairs to get an uninterrupted view of the proceedings. The main floor was jammed at 11:45 and there was only a scattering few vacant seats in the gallery.

A few minutes before 12 o'clock it was obvious that several hundred more people had been admitted to the delegates' section of the main floor than could be possibly seated there. Every seat was occupied, all the aisles were jammed. The overflows were made up of Chicago plain clothes men.
