GRAFT CHARGES CAUSE ARREST OF LEGISLATORS.

CHARLESTON, W. Va., Feb. 12.—Arrest of from six to ten members of the state legislature, involving many "higher-ups" is expected here today, following the alleged graft disclosures in the state's governing body, which caused five arrests yesterday. It is reported that W. S. Edwards, progressive candidate for United States senator, employed Burns' detectives who made the arrests to date, but many republicans assert the democrats in the legislature also participated in the exposure in the hope of involving ten or more republicans.
